**Qualification of Tourism Professionals**  
**Notification No. 3/2020**  
**1382 ME, 9th day of Wah Khaung**  
**(27<sup>th</sup> August, 2020)**

On 17-9-2018, the Myanmar Tourism Law was signed by the President and promulgated by the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw. The Central Committee for National Tourism Development was formed according to Chapter (3), Article 4 of Myanmar Tourism Law, the Tourism Committee was formed as per Chapter 4, Section 6 of the law, the Regional Tourism Committee was formed according to the Chapter 6, Article 9 of the law, and it was announced that the selection of experts from the members at the committee level must be in accordance with the following qualifications:

- (a) Must be a citizen of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.
- (b) Must have a Bachelor's or Master's Degree or Doctorate in a related field of tourism. Or the Chairman of the Central Committee for National Tourism Development has recognized as a well-known tourism expert.
- (c) Must be aware of tourism policies and be able to interact with international organizations.
- (d) Must have the proof of regular occupation or technical qualifications in relation to tourism industry.
- (e) At least 10 years of working experience in the tourism industry or 5 years of experience at executive level in any tourism association.
- (f) Must have sufficient technical experience and reputation in the field of tourism.

- (g) Getting recommendations from two Tourism Associations.
- (h) Must have good communication and social skills.
- (i) Must be able to adhere to ethical matters.
- (j) Must have knowledge of tourism based on research in relation to tourism industry or working experience or one's own job.
- (k) It is required to give the time and taking responsibility for the development of the tourism industry of the Nation.
- (l) No person who is not released from the court for the case of bankruptcy.
